The following was discussed and resolved:

1. That as per the directions of the higher department admission for Sem- 1st for the session, 2024-25 shall be on CUET basis and further all Universities and Colleges have been directed to frame the common eligibility criteria for admission to sem-1st for the UT of J&K. The matter was discussed vis-à-vis the eligibility criteria framed by the University of Jammu/Cluster University of Jammu and eligibility for the admission was fixed in respect of this College as per the details of (annexed here with Annexure-1). It is further resolved that the eligibility criteria be communicated to NTA at the earliest so that the students applying for CUET can opt for this college for ensuing admission to Sem-1st.
2. That all the HODs to ensure that the uploading of Internal Assessment Records pertaining to 1st, 3rd & 5th Sem 2023-24 needs to be completed by 14th March, 2024.
3. That all the HODs to ensure that Internal Assessment Records are complete in all aspects, so that the inspection of the same can be ensured by 15th March, 2024.
4. That the examination system needs upgradation and IT integration. For this the Development committee, Examination committee, IT cell and IQAC to give the feedback so that the proposal for IT Lab. can be prepared to make the examination system ICT driven.
5. That for the timely conduct of the External exam the staff needs to ensure that syllabus of all courses of all semesters is completed timely so that the external exam process can be initiated in the first week of May for the semester-6th and in the second week for the semester 2nd & 4th. The controller of examination and the committee take the issue on the priority basis so that the result of semester-6th is not delayed and their progression does not suffer.

6. That the College needs to conduct the Internal Assessment Test of ongoing 2nd, 4th and 6th Sem at the earliest and for this the examination committee of the College to issue the centralized date sheet so that the same can be started after Holi i.e 25th March, 2024.
7. That for preparing the syllabi for upcoming V& VI Sem on the adopted NEP 2020 pattern by the College, the HODs need to initiate the process so that same can be approved through Board of Studies and Academic Council.

Minutes of Meeting

A review meeting for finalizing course codes and adopting a uniform course code nomenclature for courses offered under NEP-2020 was convened by Dr. Ravender Tickoo, Principal, GCW Parade Ground, Jammu in his office chamber on 4th of May, 2024 at 10:00 AM.

- Dr. Ravender Tickoo, Principal, GCW Parade Ground, Jammu
- Dr Avinash Gupta, Dean, Academic Affairs
- Prof Dhavinder Kumar, Controller of Examinations, GCW Parade Ground, Jammu
- Dr. Alpana Vohra, Convenor, NEP committee
- Heads of All Departments (List - Annexure 1)
- Members of NEP committee

Proceedings:

The chairperson, Dr. Ravender Tickoo, opened the floor by emphasizing upon the need to review the course code nomenclature adopted in the previous meeting as the Controller of Examinations has observed inconsistencies and confusion in the present course codes which is hampering the compilation of the result of Sem I and III.

Attendees discussed the adopted course code nomenclature and suggestions were proposed to improve upon the nomenclature and to fix all inconsistencies and confusions.

The following was discussed and resolved:

1. All courses shall be identified by 10-digit alpha numeric code as per the scheme detailed in Annexure-2. Every subject/discipline shall be identified by two English letters as detailed in table -1.
2. Numeral part of course code shall be continuous for a particular semester and no repetition of the same shall be allowed. Sequence for assigning the numeral part of the course code shall be in the order: **Major (Theory 1) > Major (Theory 2) > Major (TiP / Practical) > Minor / Vocational > MD > Skill > AEC > VAC.**
3. Subjects or the disciplines which are not offering major courses as of now can reserve the course codes of the courses not being currently offered.
4. Theory and Practical/ Theory in Practice (TiP) components of the major and minor courses of semester I and II shall be treated as separate courses to the extent of assignment of the course code. Place 4 in case of TiP course for Arts/Humanities and Commerce streams shall be represented by letter "Q" to create a distinction between practical and TiP.
5. All the HODs shall prepare the courses codes in respect of their subjects and disciplines and submit the same to CoE immediately. CoE and NEP committee shall scrutinize the same and prepare the complete directory of the course code and share the same with BoS Convenors for record and reference.

While revising the syllabi of any course, if the change in syllabi is more than 20% which shall require setting of old and new question papers for the conduct of examination, the numerical part of the code should be different from the existing one.

All HoDs/ Convenors BoS expressed their concern vis-à-vis conduct of external examination of T i P owing to non-availability of resources and no such practice in vogue in any University of the Jammu Division. It was decided that the end semester evaluation of T i P courses shall be done by teacher concerned under the supervision of HoD / other senior faculty members of the department.

8. It was also decided that the Internal assessment would be termed as 'Continuous Evaluation' and External assessment would be termed as 'End semester evaluation'.
9. **For Skill Courses / Vocational Courses / Theory in Practice:** Scheme to be devised by NEP in consultation with COE.
10. All syllabi framed must contain complete details of Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) and Programme Learning Outcomes (PLOs) in accordance with Learning Outcomes-based Curricular Framework as proposed in Curricular Framework and Credit System for the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (NEP-2020).
11. Convener BoS shall maintain complete record of proceedings of BoS and handover the record to next convener on transfer/retirement.






- The code shall be of 10 characters (Alphabets and Numerals).
- The characters shall be put at six contiguous places as per the following format:

N.B.

- Henceforth, 'Theory in Practice' shall be denoted by alphabet 'Q' instead of acronym 'TiP'
- The numerals in course codes for a given semester should be continuous for the number of courses in that particular semester.
- In semesters I and II, '4' and '2' shall refer to **two separate courses** (both for Major and Minor) for both Sciences & Arts/Humanities/Commerce streams and should have different codes for both Theory and Practical / Theory in Practice. **A student shall need to pass both these courses separately.**
- **An example pertaining to Science Stream/ Lab Based Courses:**
 - course code for Sem-I Theory Major course in Chemistry shall carry the code UCHMJT-101

- course code for Sem-I Practical Major course in Chemistry shall carry the code UCHMJ**P**-102
- course code for Sem-I Theory Minor course in Chemistry shall carry the code UCHMNT-103
- course code for Sem-I Practical Minor course in Chemistry shall carry the code UCHMNP-104

➤ **An example pertaining to Arts/Humanities/Commerce streams:**

- course code for Sem-I Theory major course in Philosophy shall carry the code UPLMJ**T**-101
- course code for Sem-I 'Theory in Practice' major course in Philosophy shall carry the code UPLMJ**Q**-102
- course code for Sem-I Theory minor course in Philosophy shall carry the code UPLMNT-103
- and course code for Sem-I 'Theory in Practice' minor course in Philosophy shall carry the code UPLMN**Q**-104

➤ **The numerals in course codes in subsequent semesters too should be continuous for the number of courses in that particular semester.**

- **An example for semester III of Arts/Humanities/Commerce streams:** if there are 3 majors comprising 02 Theory & 01 Theory in Practice courses and 1 Minor, 1 MD & 1 Skill enhancement course, then the order of numbering the courses should follow the sequence

Major (Theory 1) > Major (Theory2) > Major (Q) > Minor > MD > SEC.

For illustration, the course codes in Economics will be as under:

- UECMJT-301
- UECMJT-302
- UECMJQ-303
- UECMNT-304
- UECMDT- 305
- UECSEC*- 306

*** Skill Courses shall have a code as SE'C' and they shall be entirely practical oriented**

- **An example for semester III of Science stream:** if there are 3 majors comprising 2 Theory & 1 Practical courses and 1 minor, 1 MD & 1 Skill enhancement course, then the order of numbering the courses should follow the sequence:

Major (Theory 1) > Major (Theory2) > Major (Practical) > Minor > MD > SEC.

For illustration, the course codes in Biotechnology will be as under:

- UBTMJT-301

- UBTMJT-302
- UBTMJP-303
- UBTMNT-304
- UBTMDT-305
- UBTSEC-306

- (N. B. in case of a vocational course during 4th sem instead of minor course, the code shall be UBTVOC-406)
- For departments offering Ability Enhancement courses and Value Added courses, the course code shall follow the sequence

Major (Theory 1) > Major (Theory2) > Major (Q/Practical) > Minor > MD > Skill > AEC > VAC

- ✓ 'Q' should be considered as a separate course and refers to "Theory in Practice" for courses in Arts / Humanities and Commerce streams. It is pertinent to mention here that the adoption of "Theory in Practice" by GCW Parade Ground, Jammu has already been approved by the Academic Council. "Theory in Practice" (Q) courses should comprise of exercises drawn from all theory courses being offered in the respective semester.
- In case of revision of a course, the code should be assigned in continuity to the earlier course so that no overlapping takes place. E.g. in the above quoted example, any revised major course (requiring separate question paper for old students) will have course code UBTMJT-307.
- ✓ **For MD, VAC and AEC courses**, the code shall have numerals as per the semester being taught irrespective of the fact that the syllabus for MD course is same in all semesters.
 - For example, if course code for MD for semester 1 in Economics is UECMDT-103 then for semester 2 it should be UECMDT-203 wherein the first digit identifies the semester.

If a department is not offering any Major course at present, the codes shall be reserved for these courses in case they are offered in later sessions.

For illustration, Department of Electronics (wherein the major courses are not offered at present) shall frame the courses for semester III as under:

- UETMJT-301
- UETMJP-302
- UETMJP-303
- UETMNT-304
- UETMDT-305
- UETSEC-306

Vocational Courses shall have a code as VO'C' and they shall be entirely practical oriented

1. CURRICULUM REFORMS

- (a) After reviewing the course structure for the Major and Minor, Skill, Vocational, and other courses under NEP 2020, it was decided that one credit be treated equal to one unit so accordingly the courses having credits and units should be at par that is if the course is of four credits then the course should be consisting of four units.
- (b) for the skill pattern should be 1+2 which is one theory and 2 practical oriented units and for the vocational it should be 2+2 which is two theory and two practical units.
- (c) For the skill course the starting should be from the basics and with the progression of the learners the course can be advanced.
