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## **ACTION TAKEN REPORT**

The analysis of feedback from various stakeholders viz., Teachers, Students and Alumni regarding different aspects of the curriculum depicted a very positive practice being followed by the institution. The faculty of Government College for Women, Parade Ground Jammu makes every possible effort to be better in all the endeavours of the college. The curriculum delivery has been made more effective by adopting the following developmental changes in 2022-23:

1. Since the curricular aspects of the College are an autonomous institution, the decisive action regarding the syllabus takes place in the college itself. The Head of the Department of various subjects attend meetings of the Board of Studies with governing bodies and academic councils to make them aware of the genuine concerns of students as well as teachers regarding syllabus such as its relevance, difficulty level, etc.
2. The process of automation of the College Library has been almost completed by 75% at GCW Parade. In each session, new books have been added to the stock by all the departments so that the study material related to the syllabus could be made available to the students. Apart from this every year general books are also added to the existing repository. Moreover, e-resources have been subscribed through N-LIST in which most of the faculty members and students are registered.
3. To channelize the energy of young students in a positive direction and encourage students to participate in indoor as well as outdoor activities. Along with this, a full-fledged gymnasium has been made in the College and students are being encouraged to devote some time to their wellness and health. Recently yoga has also been adopted as a best practice by faculty as well as students of the college to maintain good mental health.

4. The College management ensured the maintenance of student-teacher ratio as per UGC norms at every step by engaging teachers on academic arrangement. In this context different subject experts were also invited to deliver guest lecture to the students on periodic basis. Moreover, career counselling sessions have been organized to make our students fit for future endeavors.

5. During the past session teachers of the College used ICT methodologies along with classroom teaching to make teaching-learning process more interactive. Interactive boards are installed in many classrooms. The teaching faculty has been extensively involved in various Faculty Development Programmes for enhancing their existing teaching skills to match the present scenario of the education system.

6. To upkeep the discipline on the campus a full-fledged Discipline committee has been framed. Also, a duty roster of all the faculty members had been constituted. The whole campus is under CCTV surveillance to ensure the safety and security of the students.

7. An IT Cell having a capacity of 20 working desktops with Wi-Fi connectivity has been made available to the students to promote e-learning among the students.

8. All efforts are made to improve the Examination and Evaluation System in the College by making it more transparent and accountable by checking and verification at different stages.

9. A full-fledged new block named Maitreyi block is added to the college campus which resolves the infrastructural constraints. In addition to this student welfare complex is built to address the student's issues. Other facilities including dispensary, sports, hostel and college grounds are upgraded.



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
